 - (d) Which three items of property does Rosalind agree to purchase from Corin's employer in As You Like It?

- (e) What gift does Rosalind give to Orlando after he wins his wrestling match in As You Like It?
- (f) Name any two places mentioned in As You Like It.
- (g) What names did Rosalind and Celia assume?
- (h) Who uttered the speech on the 'Seven Ages of Man' in As You Like It? In which scene does it occur?
- (i) What theme gradually emerges as each of the first speaker's guesses proves to be false in "Ah, Are You Digging on My Grave?"
- (j) What conventional attitudes about death does the first speaker reveal?
- (k) What does "planting rue" signify in "Ah, Are You Digging on My Grave?"
- (l) What is the name of the American poet-philosopher whose work the author has read?
- (m) Who was Marcus Aurelius and what is the name of the book in which we find his philosophy?
- (n) Who was Socrates and what did he promote?
- (o) Who is the first philosopher mentioned by Lynd in his essay?

- (f) Why is Pliny the Elder famous?

 - (a) Justify the title of the play, As You Like It.
 - (b) Discuss As You Like It as a romantic comedy.
 - (c) Write a critical appreciation of "Ah, Are You Digging on My Grave?".
 - (d) Discuss the circumstances that lead to Lynd's reading Epictetus.

 - (d) What does Sarat promise to do in order to help his sister?
 - (e) How does Bindu die and why?
 - (f) For which theatre group was Silence! The Court is in Session written? In which language was it written originally?
 - (g) Whose mock trial is held in the play? What is the charge brought against the accused?
 - (h) Which two members of the group remain absent during the play?
 - (i) Who plays the role of the judge in the mock trial? What does he do in real life?
 - (j) Who is Samant? What gift does he leave at the end of the play?

- (k) How old was Dopdi Mejhen? Where was she from?
- (I) Why was Dopdi wanted by the government?
- (m) In which year did Operation Bakuli take place? Who was its architect?
- (n) Who is Senanayak in Mahasweta Devi's "Draupadi"?
- (o) What happened to Dopdi after she was captured and brought to the camp?

 - (d) Do you consider Dopdi Mejhen in Mahasweta Devi's "Draupadi" as a voice of protest against gender and class oppression? Justify your answer.
